## Finding your way around in the dictionary

Some words in the dictionary have more than one entry. This is because one word can belong to two or more word classes (e.g. noun, verb, adjective, etc). In this example you can see that *delay* has two entries: *delay*<sup>1</sup>, which is a noun, and *delay*<sup>2</sup>, which is a verb. Notice the small numbers <sup>1</sup> and <sup>2</sup>, which tell you that there are two entries.

**delay**<sup>1</sup> /dɪˈleɪ/ noun [C/U] ★★ a situation in which something happens later or more slowly than you expected: *After a long delay, the plane finally took off.* ♦ **delay in doing sth** *Who is responsible for the delay in reaching an agreement?*

**delay**<sup>2</sup> /dɪˈleɪ/ verb ★

**1** [I/T] to do something later than is planned or expected: *They delayed the decision for as long as possible.*

**2** [T] to make someone or something late, or to slow them down: *His plane was delayed for five hours.*
